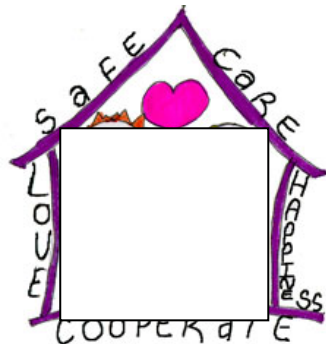
**What is a Family?**
